This service is intended to help medically treat individuals who are experiencing withdrawal issues from drugs and alcohol, so that they can begin their path to recovery.

After the inpatient stabilization phase, each patient is referred to an appropriate outpatient service or rehabilitation program for further treatment as deemed necessary.

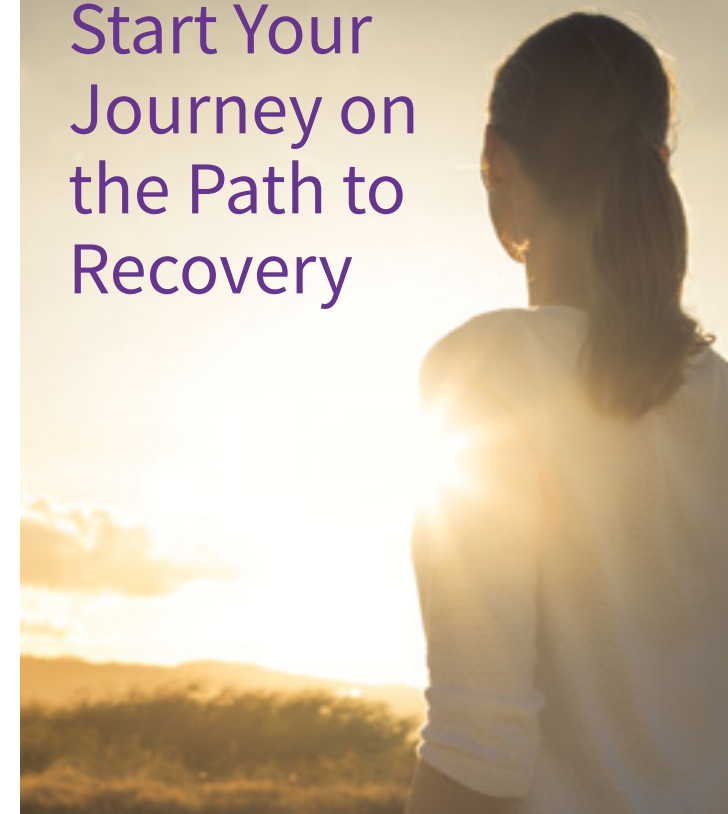

# Drug & Alcohol Medical Stabilization Service

New Vision offers inpatient medical stabilization and withdrawal management service for adults with drug, alcohol or related health issues.

## Service Overview

New Vision accepts adults who are currently experiencing active or impending withdrawal symptoms from certain drugs. It consists of a medically supervised hospital stay for inpatient stabilization that typically last 3 days. The inpatient stay includes the following aspects:

- Pre-screening
- Assessment
- Admission
- Medical Stabilization
- Appropriate discharge planning



## Medical Treatment Team

The services from New Vision offer patients a fully qualified treatment team:

- On-site intake coordinator
- Attending physician
- Nursing personnel

The medical treatment team will utilize a multidisciplinary team approach to ensure that each person receives the attention necessary for safe medical stabilization in the hospital.

The service is administered by qualified medical professionals and ensures that each person receives individualized care and safe, appropriate treatment.

## Admission Process

Upon admission to the hospital for medical stabilization, assessments of the patient's fundamental needs are conducted. These assessments include a medical history, a physical, a complete laboratory workup and a nursing assessment. This pre-screening process enables the patient to be admitted alongside a personalized plan for treatment.

Patients who are under the influence of chemical substances, and are considered medically unstable, will be closely observed and stabilized. New Vision accepts appropriate who are experiencing incapacitation due to substance use and/or symptoms from the cessation of use of certain substances, in conjunction with other related health issues.

The diagnosis of need for inpatient admission can only be made by a licensed physician. The service accepts most insurance plans.
